



Everyone's Chess Club

The Everyone's Chess Club for children and youth starts its season on **Wednesday, 2 September**. As the name suggests, the club is suitable for a wide range of participants, from those encountering chess for the first time to more experienced players. The club meets on Wednesdays from **17:15 to 18:00** (45 minutes) in the Shakkilinna teaching and coaching room (Sarvijaakonkatu 24, L2, ground floor, Tampere). The club is primarily aimed at primary school-aged children.

The club is led by **Mika Karttunen**. Mika's teaching is high-quality, fun, and takes each participant into account individually. In the Everyone's Chess Club, we don't just play chess – we also explore developmental and enjoyable tasks. Our goal is to offer all participants a sense of success, suitable challenges, and a pleasant club environment. There are no entry requirements, but those who already know the rules will certainly find challenges that match their level.

Prices

The club fee is based on attendance and is **7 €** per session (incl. VAT 25.5%). Fees are invoiced every 1–2 months. With the first invoice, a 10 € learning materials fee for the entire season is also charged. New participants are welcome to attend the first session as a trial without commitment.
